1. August 5, 2015, Business and Industry Committee Meeting Minutes

NORMAN/OLIVARES - APPROVED THE AUGUST 5, 2015, BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES (UNANIMOUS).

2. Items Referred by Other Committees

There were no items referred by other committees.

Director Keyes arrived at 4:02 p.m.

3. Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board Outstanding Achievement Awards

Blake Konczal, Executive Director, Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB), explained that FRWDB staff will be presenting achievement awards at every Business and Industry Committee (B&I) meeting for adult and youth employers quarterly. At the end of the year, a quarterly winner will be chosen for the overall annual winner. Mr. Konczal added that a winner for the youth participants will be awarded quarterly at the Youth Council meetings, and a winner for the adult participants will be awarded quarterly at the Adult Council meeting. A short video presentation revealed that the Outstanding Achievement Award for the first quarter for the adult employer was the Central California Blood Center, and for the youth employer it was TekPro PC.

Director Plascencia commented that he thought the awards were a wonderful idea.

Director Smith arrived at 4:10 p.m.

4. <u>Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board Composition Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Update</u>

Mr. Konczal explained that an update on the FRWDB Board Composition under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act had just been presented at the January 20, 2016, Special FRWDB meeting, and there were no updates to provide at this time.

This was an information item.

5. Grant and Sector Strategy Update

Mr. Konczal provided an update on the Slingshot grant. Mr. Konczal commented that a more in-depth review of the Central Valley Slingshot Project will take place at the 2nd Annual Manufacturing Summit held on March 3, 2016, at the Fresno Convention Center.

Chelsi Johnston, Research Assistant, FRWDB, provided the B&I with a handout listing the grants that the FRWDB is currently performing work on:

<u>Prop 39:</u> The FRWDB just received notice on December 14, 2015, that an additional \$300,000 was awarded to Prop 39, with the intent to be used in manufacturing.

<u>U.S. Environmental Protection Agency:</u> This grant focuses on training individuals in solid waste management, wastewater treatment and integrated pest management. FRWDB staff has been meeting with various employers to determine curriculum needs.

<u>The California Workforce Investment Board</u>: This grant is specifically for youth and young adults, and the goal is to have mass transit information incorporated into curriculum possibly starting in March for the Clovis Unified School District.

<u>Veterans Employment Assistance Program</u>: There are now 111 veterans being served in Construction Trades to prepare dislocated workers for pre-apprenticeships. The first cohort for the grant started on January 25, 2016.

6. Employer Customer Satisfaction

Christine Nutting, Deputy Director of Business Services, FRWDB, presented for the B&I's recommendation to the FRWDB, the Customer Satisfaction Report for the second quarter of Program Year (PY) 2015-2016. Ms. Nutting explained that this report reflects employer business customer satisfaction and that the FRWDB continues to be extremely high with a 4.9 out of 5 rating from employer customers.

7. <u>Second Quarter Adult and Dislocated Worker Demographics Report for Program Year</u> 2015-2016

Mr. Konczal presented the Second Quarter Adult and Dislocated Demographics Report for PY 2015-2016 per Director Norman's request at the August 5, 2015, B&I meeting. Mr. Konczal stated that the report is broken down by enrollments based on gender, age, ethnicity and barriers to employment. The various barriers were discussed and Director Gornick requested more information on how the general population in Fresno compares to the demographics report that the FRWDB provides. Mr. Konczal said that FRWDB staff can bring back census data elements at the next B&I meeting.

Director Eager arrived at 4:26 p.m.

8. Rapid Response – Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act Notice

Tamico Thomas, Senior Outplacement/Vendor Contract Specialist, FRWDB, reported that during the first and second quarter of PY 2015-2016, the Rapid Response team contacted eight (8) companies that were either downsizing or closing, and provided information to 113 dislocated workers out of the 258 employees that were affected.

2. Employer Customer Satisfaction

3. <u>Sector Focus Presentation - Manufacturing</u>

Blake Konczal, Executive Director, Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB), introduced Sam Geil, Business Development Director, Geil Consulting, to provide an overview of the work being done by the San Joaquin Valley Manufacturing Alliance (SJVMA).

Director Miller arrived at 4:05 p.m.

Mr. Geil presented to the Business and Industry (B&I) Committee a short Edge Factor video on YouTube to demonstrate the essence of what he feels the SJVMA is: bringing the industry, education, and government together to build a manufacturing ecosystem system in the valley.

Mr. Geil discussed the Pilot Manufacturing Internship Program which includes a partnership with the FRWDB, the Fresno County Career Technical Education / ROP, and the SJVMA. This program will build a workforce-ready talent pipeline by connecting youth to the Manufacturing Industry through career exploration and internships.

Mr. Geil also touched on the pilot for Vocational English as Second Language (VESL) Training on Basic Manufacturing Principles. Through Reedley College, staff will be conducting a pilot with employers to train participants with low English skills, and have an aptitude for advancement, in basic manufacturing principles like safety, troubleshooting, and motor control.

Mr. Geil provided the B&I Committee with four (4) handouts; the Mission Statement for the SJVMA, the Fourth Quarter SJVMA Membership Meeting Agenda, the 2017 Manufacturing Summit Speaker Workshop Sub-Committee Agenda, and a list of the organizations that support the SJVMA. Mr. Geil invited the B&I Committee to attend the SJVMA Fourth Quarter Membership meeting being held on December 9, 2016, at the Madera County Office of Education.

Director Zabrycki thanked Mr. Geil for all of the detailed information he provided.

4. Business / Job Seeker Recognition Quarterly Awards

Nuvia Varela, Adult/Youth Program Manager, FRWDB, presented a short video that revealed that the Outstanding Business Achievement for the Fourth Quarter had been awarded to Stratas Foods (Adult Employer), and G & R Feed Farm Supply (Youth Employer).

Joe Anderton, Plant Superintendent, Stratas Foods, was in attendance at the B&I Committee meeting and thanked FRWDB staff for providing great candidates to employ at Stratas Foods. Mr. Anderton added that Stratas Foods was approaching five (5) years with no reportable incidents and he felt that it was mainly due to the high quality of candidates placed from Workforce Connection.

Director Zabrycki asked if FRWDB staff could send a press release, or add a story in the next FRWDB newsletter that would highlight the companies that won the past year's quarterly awards, and Mr. Konczal responded that it would be a great idea.

5. Business Services Center Usage

Christine Nutting, Deputy Director of Business Services, FRWDB, provided an overview of activities and services being provided through the FRWDB's Business Services Center (BSC) and an approximate value of those services. Ms. Nutting referred the B&I Committee to the spreadsheet provided in the agenda packet which reported an approximate value of \$201,125 for services provided in Program Year (PY) 2015-2016.

6. Rapid Response – Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act Notice / Layoff Aversion Update

Tamico Thomas, Senior Outplacement/Vendor Contract Specialist, FRWDB, reported that during the Third and Fourth Quarters of PY 2015-2016, and the First Quarter of PY 2016-2017, the Rapid Response team contacted eleven (11) companies that were either downsizing or closing, and provided information to 171 dislocated workers out of the 514 employees that were affected.

Ms. Thomas also discussed the layoff aversion strategies and activities that are designed to prevent layoffs and/or closures or minimize the duration of unemployment.

Director Zabrycki commented that businesses are very fortunate that the FRWDB offers rapid response or layoff aversion when faced with difficult times.

SUBJECT:

Sector Focus Presentation - Construction

INFORMATION:

According to the California Employment Development Department's (EDD) Labor Market Information (LMI), "construction is expected to be the fastest growing sector at 37.7 percent growth rate [in the Fresno Metropolitan Areal, with specialty trade contractors contributing the majority of the growth." This amounts to approximately 2,600 jobs by 2022.

Regionally, construction is projected to add 4,800 jobs in San Joaquin County from 2014-2024¹; 3,300 jobs in Stanislaus County from 2012-2022²; 1,300 jobs in Merced County from 2014-2024³; 500 jobs in Madera County from 2014-2024; 210 jobs in Kings County from 2014-20245; 2,100 jobs in Tulare County from 2012-2022⁶; and 2,400 jobs in Kern County from 2012-2022⁷.

As a part of this trend, the Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB) has been spearheading regional multi-craft pre-apprenticeships in the building and construction trades for almost a decade. Starting in 2008, FRWDB partnered with Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E) to meet the growing demand in the energy workforce. Since then, FRWDB has been awarded three (3) grants totaling over \$3 million from the California Workforce Development Board to train veterans, disadvantaged workers, and dislocated workers among others.

Blake Konczal, Executive Director, FRWDB, will discuss highlights of the regional work the FRWDB has done and is continuing with construction with a focus on the following initiative:

- Proposition 39: Pre-Apprenticeship Support, Training, and Placement Grant
 - Goal: Fill critical workforce gaps; implement and support energy efficiency focused "earn-and-learn" job training and placement programs.
 - WDBs: San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Merced, Madera, Fresno, Tulare, Kings, Kern, Inyo, Mono.
 - Building Trades Councils (BTCs): Fresno, Madera, Tulare, and Kings Counties; Kern, Inyo, Mono Counties: San Joaquin, Calaveras, Alpine Counties; Stanislaus, Merced, Mariposa, Tuolumne BTC.
 - People Expected to train: 226; trained to date: 111; future cohorts: Bakersfield, February 6; Fresno, February 13, and Modesto, February 21. Clients working as: Cement Masons, Carpenters, Operating Engineers, Solar Installers, Sheet Metal Workers, and in other construction related employment.

Chuck Riojas, FRWDB Director and Secretary-Treasurer, Fresno, Madera, Kings, and Tulare Counties Building Trades Council, will provide an overview of the work being done by the Building Trades Council regarding pre-apprenticeships and apprenticeships, including the City of Fresno National Targeted Hiring Initiative. The initiative allows the City of Fresno to hire workers on public works projects from economically disadvantaged areas; it specifically calls for 15% of all project work hours within each trade performed by Nationally Targeted Workers. A National Targeted Worker is an individual who resides in a National Economically Disadvantaged Area as defined by the Census Bureau.
