Item Description/Action Taken

1. February 1, 2017, Business and Industry Committee Meeting Minutes

GUZMAN/MILLER - APPROVED THE FEBRUARY 1, 2017, BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES (UNANIMOUS).

2. Ratification of New Business and Industry Committee Member

Blake Konczal, Executive Director, FRWDB, stated that Corinna Pereira had expressed interest in becoming a member of the B&I Committee. Corinna Pereira is the Workplace Learning Liaison with West Hills Community College District.

Mr. Konczal requested that the B&I Committee recommend that the FRWDB ratify the appointment at the December 6, 2017, meeting.

MILLER/GUZMAN - RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB RATIFY CORINNA PEREIRA AS A NEW BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE MEMBER. (UNANIMOUS)

3. Employer Customer Satisfaction

Christine Nutting, Deputy Director of Business Services, FRWDB, presented for the B&I's recommendation to the FRWDB, the Customer Satisfaction Report for the Third Quarter of Program Year (PY) 2016-2017. Ms. Nutting explained that the report reflected employer business customer satisfaction, and that the FRWDB continues to be rated extremely high with a 4.8 out of 5 rating from employer customers.

KEYES/GUZMAN - RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB ACCEPT THE EMPLOYER CUSTOMER SATISFACTION REPORT (UNANIMOUS).

5. <u>Sector Strategy and Operational Changes</u>

Mr. Konczal explained that the FRWDB has continued to make changes to sector strategies to improve the business outreach functions. Mr. Konczal introduced the two (2) new Business and Workforce Consultant (BWC) hires, Victoria Lemus and Shawna Glazener, currently housed at the Business Services Center (BSC). The BWC's will focus on the industry sectors, and determining what the needs are for those employers.

This was an information item.

6. <u>Business Services Center Usage</u>

Ms. Nutting provided an overview of activities and services being provided through the FRWDB's BSC and an approximate value of those services. Ms. Nutting referred the B&I Committee to the spreadsheet provided in the agenda packet which reported an approximate value of \$223,472 for services provided in PY 2016-2017.

Director Olivares asked for more information regarding the no-cost Human Resources (HR) Hotline that the BSC provides. Ms. Nutting explained that businesses could call in during business hours and get an immediate response on all types of various HR issues. The HR hotline has proved to be a beneficial tool in the Fresno community.

This was an information item.

7. Rapid Response - Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act Notice

Ms. Nutting reported that during the third and fourth quarters of PY 2016-2017, the Rapid Response team contacted fourteen (14) companies that were either downsizing or closing, and provided information to 113 dislocated workers out of the 392 employees that were affected.

This was an information item.

8. November 1, 2017, Agenda Items

Mr. Konczal mentioned that he would like to bring data back to the B&I Committee to show how the employer unemployment rates for Fresno County have differed over the last few years with the current rate at seven and a half percent (7.5)%.

Director Olivares would like to have a discussion about the impact that the minimum wage increase on January 1, 2017, will have on Fresno businesses.

Business and Industry Vice Chair Selection

INFORMATION:

As outlined in the following Section of the Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board's (FRWDB) Bylaws, the FRWDB's Councils and Committees must have both a Chair and Vice Chair identified.

Section 6.01 Creation of Standing Committees. Subject to the provisions of the Joint Powers Agreement and the Workforce Investment Act, the Board shall have the authority to create and disband one or more standing committees of the FRWDB. Each standing committee shall consist of two (2) or more Directors, and other persons that the Directors may appoint to serve at the pleasure of the Board, including individuals who are not members of the Board. The appointments to such standing committees shall be by majority vote of the Directors then in office. Each standing committee shall have a chair and a vice chair, both of whom must be a member of the Board. The chair of each standing committee shall be appointed by the Chair, subject to ratification by majority vote of the Directors then in office. The vice chair of each standing committee shall be appointed by the committee chair, subject to ratification by majority vote of the Directors then in office. The standing committee chair shall assume the duties of the standing committee chair in his or her absence. Any standing committee, to the extent provided in the Board motion by which it is formed, shall only have the authority delegated by the Board. All standing committees shall observe strict compliance with the Ralph M. Brown Act.

The Business and Industry Committee will discuss the process and recommendations.

As requested by your committee, and in an effort to stay abreast of economic developments in Fresno County, Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board staff provides the Business and Industry Committee a quarterly update of Rapid Response activity as it applies to business closures or downsizing.

During the First and Second Quarters of Program Year (PY) 2017-2018, the Rapid Response team contacted four (4) companies that were either downsizing or closing, and provided information to 251 dislocated workers out of the 336 employees that were affected.
