Item Description/Action Taken

1. April 18, 2018, Executive Committee Meeting Minutes

Blake Konczal, Executive Director, Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB) requested approval of the April 18, 2018, meeting minutes.

RIOJAS/MONTALBANO – APPROVED THE APRIL 18, 2018, EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES. (UNANIMOUS)

2. Items Referred by Other Committees

There were no items referred by other Committees.

3. May 2018 Financial Report

Cheryl Beierschmitt, Deputy Director of Fiscal Services, FRWDB, presented the May 2018 Financial Report for the Executive Committee's (Committee's) acceptance and she indicated that FRWDB staff had no concerns with the report. The Committee had no questions.

MILLER/RIOJAS - ACCEPTED THE MAY 2018 FINANCIAL REPORT. (UNANIMOUS)

4. May 2018 Agency Budget and Expenditures Report

Ms. Beierschmitt presented the May 2018 Agency Budget and Expenditures Report for the Committee's acceptance and indicated that FRWDB staff had no concerns with the report. The Committee had no questions.

HENSLEY/MILLER- ACCEPTED THE MAY 2018 AGENCY BUDGET AND EXPENDITURES REPORT. (UNANIMOUS)

5. Program Year 2018-2019 Agency Budget and Personnel Plan

Mr. Konczal presented for the Committee's recommendation to the FRWDB, the Program Year 2018-2019 Agency Budget and Personnel Plan. Mr. Konczal stated that FRWDB staff is anticipating an increase in funding of \$2.2 million and explained that the increase would come from two (2) sources: 1) carryover from the previous program year, and 2) increased allocation from the state. He further explained that the state's allocation formula is based on data such as population, poverty rate, and unemployment rate, and while the unemployment rate for the entire state has been improving, the rate at which Fresno County's unemployment has improved has been slower than the rest of the state. He noted that there were minor increases in the budget's line items for local mileage, insurance, utilities, and furniture and equipment, and stated that the increase in furniture and equipment was for a new computer firewall, a Microsoft SQL upgrade, a new network switch, and the replacement of phones and computer equipment. Director Montalbano asked why these types of items were listed under "furniture and equipment". Legal Counsel Price explained that it is how the state defines them.

RIOJAS/MILLER – RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB APPROVE THE PROGRAM YEAR 2018-2019 AGENCY BUDGET AND PERSONNEL PLAN. (UNANIMOUS)

6. Update Conflict of Interest Code

Ken Price, Legal Counsel, Baker, Manock & Jensen, stated that every two (2) years, under the California Political Reform Act, all local governmental and state agencies are required to adopt a Conflict of Interest (COI) Code. He explained that, essentially, a COI Code identifies which financial interests board members and certain designated staff members have to disclose to the public. The County of Fresno provided an updated COI Code template for the FRWDB's adoption. The new template included language that allows for an electronic system for filing Form 700s. The new template also included the addition of alternate board members; however, the FRWDB does not have these, so all references to alternate board members will be deleted from the FRWDB's COI Code.

Once approved by the FRWDB, the COI Code will be filed with the Fresno County Clerk's Office.

MONTALBANO/RIOJAS - RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB APPROVE THE UPDATED CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE, WITH THE REVISION STATED ABOVE. (UNANIMOUS)

7. Director's Quarterly Update

Mr. Konczal provided the Committee with an overview of the projects he focused on over the past quarter.

New Training – Earlier this year, Mr. Konczal and FRWDB staff, along with staff from West Hills Community College, Kings County's Workforce Development Board, Tulare County's Workforce Development Board, and College of Sequoias, attended a meeting in Kings County regarding training for jobs to assemble electric cars at the new Faraday Motors facility going in to Kings County. As the FRWDB's first training cohort at West Hills College Lemoore concludes, FRWDB staff is moving forward with plans for a second cohort, and will look at what worked well in the first training and ways the training can be improved.

SlingShot Grant – Mr. Konczal reported that the SlingShot grant, which he has talked about in previous FRWDB and Executive Committee meetings, has ended. The grant had a manufacturing focus and covered multiple counties. The state has now awarded the FRWDB an additional \$250,000 under SlingShot 2.0 to assist the re-entry population/parolees in training for pre-apprenticehips in the construction trades.

SB1 – Mr. Konczal reminded the Committee that \$5 million of SB1 funds will be up for award in January to be used for various infrastructure projects, as well as for pre-apprentice training. The FRWDB, with the support of several valley Building and Construction Trades Unions, is preparing to apply for a portion of these funds. There is a Proposition to repeal SB1, but even if the repeal is successful, the \$5 million has already been earmarked and will be awarded. If the bill is not repealed, there would be an additional \$5 million available for award.

Mr. Konczal mentioned that he and some FRWDB staff have been meeting about repositioning the FRWDB from a marketing and public relations standpoint, and once they have a cohesive plan, they will bring it to the Committee. Mr. Konczal concluded his update by sharing that he and Director Riojas participated in a tour of the IBEW training facility in Fresno, which Lt. Governor Newsom also attended. The Lt. Governor was able to meet one-on-one with several individuals who were trained through the FRWDB's pre-apprentice training program and their feedback about their training was very positive. Mr. Konczal had the opportunity to share with the Lt. Governor that all the pre-apprentice training the FRWDB has done over the past eight (8) years was made possible by grants from the state.

SUBJECT: Rapid Response Funding Pool

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend that the Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB) approve the allocation of Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Rapid Response and Layoff Aversion funds as outlined in this item.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:

The FRWDB has received \$350,896 of WIOA Rapid Response and Layoff Aversion funds from the Employment Development Department (EDD), Workforce Services Division, for Program Year (PY) 2018-2019. There is also \$69,054 in carryover funds from PY 17-18, for a total of \$419,950 available funding for PY 18-19.

In PY 2014-2015, the state did a major redesign of the Rapid Response system. Under the new design, Rapid Response funds are allocated in two (2) categories: 1) Rapid Response reactive services, for immediate response to layoffs and business closures, and 2) Layoff Aversion proactive services, to provide services to employers to prevent layoffs and rapid reemployment services in the event of a layoff or business closure.

With the redesign of the system, Rapid Response is no longer an event driven process. It is a proactive Business Engagement approach, which requires: 1) Ongoing efforts to build relationships with employers and other community stakeholders, 2) Knowledge of labor market trends and economic forecasts, 3) Strategic planning, data gathering and analysis designed to anticipate, prepare for, and manage economic transition, 4) Understanding workforce assets and needs, 5) Convening, facilitating, and brokering connections, networks, and partners, and 6) Planning for and responding to layoffs, minimizing their impacts wherever possible.

To ensure that Rapid Response funding is being utilized to meet these deliverables, FRWDB staff is recommending the allocation of Rapid Response funding as follows:

- \$294,950 to the FRWDB to provide oversight and coordination of Rapid Response activities and proactive direct business engagement services.
- Set aside \$125,000 for the procurement of specialized Business Engagement and Layoff Aversion Consultants to work in cooperation with existing FRWDB business services staff to address the needs of industry and support the local workforce development system.
