Youth Council Meeting November 19, 2020 <u>SUMMARY MINUTES</u>

The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. and was held via Zoom.

CHAIR/STAFF REPORT:

Blake Konczal, Executive Director, Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB), thanked Director Montalbano for his service as Youth Council Chair and acknowledged his new position as Vice Chair of the FRWDB.

Director Raine Bumatay was appointed as Chair of the Council and her appointment will be ratified at the December 2, 2020, FRWDB meeting.

Item Description/Action Taken

1. May 21, 2020, Youth Council Meeting Minutes

Mr. Konczal presented the May 21, 2020, meeting minutes for correction and/or approval.

BAUER/MARTINDALE – RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB ACCEPT THE MAY 21, 2020, YOUTH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES. VOTE: YES – 11, NO – 0 (UNANIMOUS)

2. Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board Outstanding Achievement Awards

Ana Escareno, Youth Program Coordinator, FRWDB, reported that the FRWDB Outstanding Achievement Award for the First Quarter of Program Year (PY) 2020-2021 was awarded to Saul Godinez. Mr. Godinez is a Call Taker for American Ambulance. The Outstanding Achievement Award winner for the Second Quarter of PY 2020-2021 was Clifton Young. Mr. Young is pursuing a career as a fire fighter.

This was an information item.

3. Youth Services Delivery and COVID-19

Phyllis Stogbauer, Senior Deputy Director, FRWDB, provided an update on the delivery of youth services under COVID-19. She explained that after determining that the FRWDB was an essential business, FRWDB staff began drafting operational guidelines to ensure continuation of critical services in Fresno County. Those guidelines included operational guidelines as well as safety protocols for all Workforce Connection offices. Ms. Stogbauer noted that the Workforce Connection offices remained open during the pandemic.

This was an information item.

4. <u>Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Young Adult Work Experience Expenditures</u> <u>Report</u>

Ms. Stogbauer reported that Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) formula funding has a two (2) year life cycle and that local areas are mandated to fully expend the required Work Experience funding by June 30th of the following Program Year (PY). The total Work Experience allocation for PY 2018-2019 was \$997,704.54 and was required to be fully expended by June 30, 2020, but was fully expended by December 2019.

The total Work Experience allocation for PY 2019 – 2020 was \$1,106.526, which is required to be fully expended by June 30, 2021. The total expenditures through June 30, 2020, were at \$978,090.62, and staff had no concerns regarding expending the PY 2019-2020 funds by the June 30, 2021, mandated date.

5. <u>Fourth Quarter Local Performance Results Report for Program Year 2019-2020</u>

Ms. Stogbauer presented the Fourth Quarter Local Performance Results for PY 2019-2020 for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB. Ms. Stogbauer reviewed the report with the Council and indicated that the majority of providers did fairly well. West Hills Community College District (WHCCD) results were below their performance goals, and Proteus was slightly below on their Out-of-School Youth performance goals. She stated that performance goals this quarter were impacted by the COVID-19, especially in the rural areas, as it was more difficult to recruit participants and obtain new enrollments during the pandemic.

6. First Quarter Local Performance Results Report for Program Year 2020-2021

Ms. Stogbauer presented the First Quarter Local Performance Results for PY 2020-2021 for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB. Ms. Stogbauer noted there were no major issues, and performance results were impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. She mentioned

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that the new performance goals were released on October, but they were retroactive to July. She noted that even though the goal increased from 65.5% to 73.5%, the majority, with the exception of WHCCD's In-School Youth program, met or exceeded their numbers. She also mentioned that two (2) youth participants were co-enrolled using an adult code in error. FRWDB staff corrected the Out of School attainment rate for the Youth Offender Services on the report by changing to 75% from 50%. FRWDB staff had no concerns with the results at this time.

VUICICH/BARNES - RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB ACCEPT THE FIRST QUARTER LOCAL PERFORMANCE RESULTS REPORT FOR PROGRAM YEAR 2020-2021. VOTE: YES – 11, NO – 0 (UNANIMOUS)

7. Fourth Quarter Young Adult Satisfaction Report for Program Year 2019-2020

Stephen DeWitt, Quality Systems and Procurement Manager, FRWDB, presented the Fourth Quarter Young Adult Satisfaction Report for PY 2019-2020 for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB. Mr. DeWitt indicated that the survey response rate for this reporting period was at 100%. He indicated that survey results averaged 42.6% in the Extremely Satisfied category, 30.14% in the Satisfied category, Neutral at 26.8% and Dissatisfied at .4%.

TUTUNJIAN/BARNES – RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB ACCEPT THE FOURTH QUARTER YOUNG ADULT SATISFACTION REPORT FOR PROGRAM YEAR 2019-2020. VOTE YES – 11, NO - 0 (UNANIMOUS)

8. <u>Young Adult Program Exit Survey Update</u>

Mr. DeWitt reminded the Council that at the May 21, 2020, Youth Council meeting, there was a discussion regarding the Neutral category on the Youth Satisfaction Survey conducted upon exit. He reported that in collaboration with providers and FRWDB staff, the question was revised and that question was implemented on July 1, 2020, as a pilot question.

This was an information item.

9. First Quarter Young Adult Satisfaction Report for Program Year 2020-2021

Mr. DeWitt presented the First Quarter Young Adult Satisfaction Report for PY 2020-2021 for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB. He reported that the survey tool was updated as discussed in the previous agenda item, and as a result of that change to the scoring for the Neutral category, he believed the report more accurately reflected the experiences of the Young Adults. Mr. DeWitt noted that the FRWDB received a number of positive comments from participants.

10. Fourth Quarter Provider of Services' Monitoring Report for Program Year 2019-2020

Mr. DeWitt presented the Fourth Quarter Provider of Services' Monitoring Report for PY 2019-2020 for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB. Mr. DeWitt reported that WHCCD had

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a total of six (6) findings during this period, five (5) of which were conditionally closed. He noted that FRWDB staff will review those same areas closely until the next review. The Fresno Economic Opportunities Commission had three (3) issues: One (1) issue was conditionally closed and the other two (2) were closed.

Mr. DeWitt presented the First Quarter Provider of Services' Monitoring Report for PY 2020-2021 for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB. He reported that the FRWDB did not complete any program monitoring during this period, but were currently in the process of monitoring ResCare (now known as Equus). Director Barnes noted that there was a typo in the PY date in the report title. Mr. DeWitt confirmed that the date was incorrect and stated it would be corrected.

Mr. Giles stated that pursuant to the Council's direction, staff included a comparison to the same quarter of the prior year on the report. Mr. Giles indicated that there were a significant number of no responses. He also noted there was an error on the barriers graph, and presented the Council with the corrected information.

15. First Quarter Youth Demographics Reports for Program Year 2020-2021

Mr. Giles presented the First Quarter Youth Demographics Reports for PY 2020-2021. He reported the numbers did drop significantly in the first quarter, and the comparison on the first quarter to last year's first quarter was significantly different in total enrollments.




Year-to-Date Local Performance Results









Additional administrative responsibilities shall include assessing the performance and evaluating the benefit, productivity, and impact of all programs funded under the WIOA, as amended or superseded, and submitting progress reports.

As part of this responsibility, FRWDB staff has implemented the Youth Program Satisfaction process and data collection system. The FRWDB's sub-contracted providers of services submit their data to staff on a monthly basis. The data is aggregated, analyzed and reviewed on a quarterly basis and reported to this Council.


FRWDB staff work with service providers to improve the processes used to increase the satisfaction level with our youth and young adult participants. These improvements are based on data collected through these satisfaction surveys, monitoring reviews, complaints and monthly operations meetings between providers and FRWDB staff.

This report represents the completion of a six (6) month pilot with a revised question relating to the experience with the assessments. This change has resulted in more accurate responses and has resulted in high satisfaction scores. Staff seeks approval to formalize the change.


