SUBJECT: Resolution to Allow for Electronic Board Meetings Pursuant to AB361 and Making Requisite Findings of State of Emergency Due to COVID-19

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt resolution authorizing the agency to allow the Business and Industry Committee (Committee) to participate via teleconference so long as such actions comply with newly adopted AB 361.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:

Governor Newsom's Executive Order No. N-29-20, which allows some or all Directors/Committee Members to participate in a public meeting via teleconference (phone or video) expired as of September 30, 2021.

On September 15, 2021, AB 361 was passed which includes the following:

Through December 31, 2023, AB 361 allows local agencies to continue to use COVID-19-era teleconferencing notice and meeting procedures as long as one (1) of the following specific types of emergency exists:

- A. The legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency, and state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing.
- B. The legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.
- C. The legislative body holds a meeting during a proclaimed state of emergency and has determined, by majority vote, pursuant to subparagraph (B), that, as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

The Committee members must make specific findings every 30 days during the emergency when telephonic or virtual meetings are required. The Governor, through Order N-12-21, has extended the order declaring a State of Emergency due to the impacts of COVID-19 until the end of the year, so these findings must be made every 30 days beginning on October 1, 2021:

- A. The legislative body has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency.
- B. Any of the following circumstances exist:
 - (i) The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person; or
 - (ii) State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

The new law also prohibits local agencies from requiring public comments to be submitted prior to the meeting without *also* allowing real-time comment opportunities during the meeting. In addition, the new law allows third-party internet websites to collect names and other information from the public in order to participate in the meeting, but local agencies themselves are still prohibited from requiring the such information to participate. Finally, if there is an internet or telephonic service disruption that prevents the agency from broadcasting the meeting, the agency may take no action until the broadcast is restored. Normal posting timelines for agendas still apply, as well as the roll-call vote requirement.

Attached is a resolution authorizing meeting by teleconference. This resolution shall apply to the initial Board of Directors meeting and each standing committee meeting from November 3 through December 3, 2021.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE OF THE FRESNO REGIONAL WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD ("FRWDB") ACKNOWLEDGING A LOCAL EMERGENCY, RATIFYING THE PROCLAMATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY BY N-12-21 ISSUED ON AUGUST 16, 2021 AND AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE OF THE FRWDB FOR THE PERIOD FROM NOVEMBER 3, 2021 TO DECEMBER 3, 2021 PURSUANT TO BROWN ACT PROVISIONS.

WHEREAS, the Business and Industry Committee of the FRWDB (the "Committee") is committed to preserving and nurturing public access and participation in meetings of the Committee; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of the Committee are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act (Cal. Gov. Code 54950 – 54963), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the Committee conduct its business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, Government Code section 54953(e), makes provisions for remote teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, a required condition is that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, a proclamation is made when there is an actual incident, threat of disaster, or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the jurisdictions that are within FRWDB's boundaries, caused by natural, technological, or human-caused disasters; and

WHEREAS, it is further required that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, such conditions now exist, specifically, by the Governor's Order N-12-21, the Governor has extended the order declaring a State of Emergency due to the impacts of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the County of Fresno has recommended continued social distancing to combat the imminent risk to the public health and safety due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Committee as a legislative body of FRWDB would normally be covered under any resolution adopted by the Board of Directors of FRWDB; however, the Committee meets prior to the next meeting of the Board of Directors;

WHEREAS, the Committee does hereby find that such conditions have caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of peril to the safety of persons within Fresno County that are likely to be beyond the control of agency services, personnel, equipment, and facilities, and desires to proclaim a local emergency and ratify the proclamation of state of emergency by the Governor of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, as a consequence of the local emergency, the Committee does hereby find that the legislative bodies of the District shall conduct their meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Government Code section 54953, as authorized by subdivision (e) of section 54953, and that such legislative bodies shall comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to the meetings as prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of section 54953; and

WHEREAS, FRWDB shall ensure that the public has the opportunity to participate live in all electronic meetings of the Committee during all public comment periods.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE OF FRWDB DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Recitals</u>. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. <u>Acknowledgment of Local Emergency</u>. The Committee hereby acknowledges that a local emergency now exists throughout Fresno County, and full in-person meetings could cause an imminent risk to the Committee members, staff and public.

Section 3. <u>Ratification of Governor's Proclamation of a State of Emergency</u>. The Committee hereby ratifies the Governor of the State of California's Proclamation of State of Emergency, effective as of its issuance date of August 16, 2021.

Section 4. <u>Remote Teleconference Meetings</u>. The agency staff is hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date of Resolution</u>. This Resolution shall take effect on November 3, 2021, and stay in effect at such time the FRWDB Directors or the Committee adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of the District may continue to teleconference without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953.

Business and Industry Committee May 5, 2021 <u>SUMMARY MINUTES</u>

The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m.

Item Description/Action Taken

1. <u>February 3, 2021, Business and Industry Committee Meeting Minutes</u>

Erik Cherkaski, Business Services Manager, Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB) presented the February 3, 2021, meeting minutes for correction and/or approval.

SILVEIRA /OLIVARES – APPROVED THE FEBRUARY 3, 2021, BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES (UNANIMOUS).

2. Rapid Response – Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act Notice

Martha Espinosa, Marketing and Special Projects Manager, FRWDB, reported on Rapid Response services provided in the Third Quarter of Program Year (PY) 2020-2021. She shared the Fresno county's unemployment rate information from the Labor Market Report, which showed a 1.5% increase in unemployment in March 2021, compared to March 2020.

During the Third Quarter, the Rapid Response team contacted companies that were either downsizing or closing, and provided an Orientation to 49 dislocated workers and business owners. There were 1,985 employees affected during this quarter.

The FRWDB Rapid Response team, to date, has hosted 46 Orientations since the start of the pandemic, with 759 individuals in attendance. Since January 2021, there were three (3) permanent store closures with 98 individuals impacted.

The team is still working with the Internal Revenue Service, Butler Ave location closure, with the first wave of layoffs in June impacting 853 employees and the second in September impacting 855 employees. In June there will be more details on Fresno Economic Opportunity Commission's layoff within their Childcare Program impacting anywhere from 112 to 581 employees.

The results from the Spring Virtual Job Fair sponsored by the Rapid Response team in partnership with the City of Fresno was a huge success with 43 employers participating. The event attracted 182 attendees and resulted in 424 resumes being submitted.

3. <u>Manufacturing Upskill Training</u>

Mr. Cherkaski and Craig Scharton, Client Advisor, California Manufacturing Technology Consulting (CMTC) discussed their office's collaborative efforts in offering upskill training programs to local manufacturers. Particular focus was placed on the demand for computer aided design (CAD) and SOLDIWORKS training.

Mr. Sharton brought up the business-friendly nature of the FRWDB, and the benefits of the Incumbent Worker Training (IWT) Program. He provided an example of how the IWT Program propelled a local manufacturer to design a new piece of firefighting equipment that is projecting \$40,000 in additional sales per month. The training has led several companies to design products more quickly and inexpensively because they can now do it in house, while increasing employees' skillsets and career advancement opportunities. Also, the training was provided by a local company, Valley CAD, located in Reedley.

This was an information item.

4. <u>Rural Business Outreach</u>

Veronica McAlister, Business Services Coordinator, FRWDB, shared that the second cohort of the Central Valley Forestry Corps training program completed training with 16 participants receiving job offers. Currently, the third cohort is underway and one (1) participant is from the area affected by the Creek Fire and was inspired to join the training program after his family lost their home.

Ms. McAlister also shared that the FRWDB just received funding for the National Dislocated Worker Grant for the Creek Fire. These funds will allow the FRWDB to recruit 75 individuals to temporary jobs for the next 18 months to continue the Creek Fire clean up.

Juan Carranza, Business Services Coordinator, FRWDB, shared that he continues to serve the West side of Fresno County. He discussed his efforts to strengthen the FRWDB's rural presence and awareness of services. Mr. Carranza has been working closely with the U. S. Small Business Administration in outreach efforts for their Restaurant Revitalization Fund for small businesses. He also discussed continued collaborative efforts with rural coalition groups, such as the Central Valley Immigrant Integration Collaborative (CVIIC) Entrepreneur Program for Immigrant Business Owners and Alianza Del Valle, in targeting Spanish speaking businesses through Facebook Live

events. Mr. Carranza ended his presentation with discussing a new business grant program he is working on with the City of Firebaugh.

This was an information item.

5. Fourth Quarter Awards Business Recognition

Mr. Cherkaski presented a video that revealed the Outstanding Business Achievement Award winners for the Fourth Quarter of 2020: Dycora Transitional Health for the adult employer and Borga Steel in Fowler for the youth employer.

Director Olivares and Chair Zabrycki discussed with staff their desire to see these videos broadcast on the local news channels and during the State of the County address.

This was an information item.

6. Agenda Items for August 4, 2021, Meeting

Chair Zabrycki reminded the Committee that if they have any items to be added to the agenda for the August 4, 2021, meeting, to send those items to FRWDB staff at least two (2) weeks before the meeting.

7. <u>Meeting Feedback</u>

Mr. Cherkaski asked the Committee if they had any suggestions on how these meetings might be improved. The Committee provided no feedback.

INFORMATION:

As requested by your committee, and in an effort to stay abreast of economic developments in Fresno County, Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB) staff provides the Business and Industry Committee a quarterly update of Rapid Response activity as it applies to business closures or downsizing.

During the Fourth Quarter of Program Year (PY) 2020-2021, the Rapid Response team contacted nine (9) companies that were either downsizing or closing, and provided an Orientation to 271 dislocated workers and business owners. Overall, there were 1,052 employees that were affected during this quarter.

In addition, during the Fourth Quarter of PY 2020-2021, the Rapid Response Coordinator conducted one (1) in-person event (Resource/Job Fair) to assist with Rapid Re-Employment Services that had 144 individuals in attendance. FRWDB staff also created and emailed a resume building video via YouTube to 496 IRS participants, and the video was posted for public view.

During the First Quarter of PY 2021-2022, the Rapid Response team contacted four (4) companies that were either downsizing or closing. Fortunately, two (2) of these companies did not need services, as employees have already obtained employment. The Rapid Response team is currently in the planning stages for an anticipated mass layoff in early 2022.
