

## What is an Entrance Interview?

The Young Adult Services (YAS) Entrance Interview is a chance for us to talk realisitically with you about your specific needs, current situation, and career and educational goals. The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funds are not an entitlement for services and with limited resources, the Workforce Connection YAS cannot enroll every applicant into the program.

The YAS Entrance Interview is one method used to ensure applicants will be able to complete all requirements of the Workforce Connection YAS.

The interview will last approximately 30-45 minutes and you will be asked specific questions on your educational and career goals and any barriers you may have.

## How do you prepare for an Entrance Interview?

Upon completion of the YAS Orientation you will be scheduled for an Entrance Interview. It is very important that you arrive on time. If for any reason you cannot make the scheduled interview date and time, please call the office as early as possible to reschedule the interview.
