COMMITTEE CHAIR/STAFF COMMENTS: Blake Konczal, Executive Director, Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB), shared that the FRWDB held its Annual Achievement Awards breakfast that morning and that it was great to hear the heartwarming stories of the award winners. Director Blunt commented that the event continues to get better year after year. Chair Montalbano added that it was nice to see the award winners' families there, as well.

Director Blunt shared that, at the awards breakfast, Supervisor Quintero presented Mr. Konczal with a certificate and named April 17, 2024, Blake Konczal Day in the County of Fresno.

1. January 17, 2024, Executive Committee Meeting Minutes

Mr. Konczal presented the January 17, 2024, Executive Committee (Committee) meeting minutes for approval, or correction and approval.

RIOJAS/BLUNT – APPROVED THE JANUARY 17, 2024, EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES. (UNANIMOUS)

2. February 2024 Financial Report

Cheryl Beierschmitt, Deputy Director of Fiscal Services, FRWDB, presented the February 2024 Financial Report for the Committee's acceptance. She spoke to each of the bullet points included on the agenda item and indicated that FRWDB staff had no concerns with any items on the report.

BLUNT/BARNES – ACCEPTED THE FEBRUARY 2024 FINANCIAL REPORT (UNANIMOUS) <u>February 2024 Agency Budget and Expenditures</u>

Ms. Beierschmitt presented the February 2024 Agency Budget and Expenditures report for the Committee's acceptance. She explained that the year-to-date budget was straight-lined, and then brought the Furniture and Equipment line item to the Committee's attention. She indicated that new furniture was purchased and installed for the FRWDB's administrative office, so that line item was showing negative due to the straight line effect and because the furniture purchase posted in February 2024. There were no questions from the Committee about the report.

ZABRYCKI/RIOJAS – ACCEPTED THE FEBRUARY 2024 AGENCY BUDGET AND EXPENDITURES REPORT (UNANIMOUS)

4. <u>Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Contract Recapture of Funds for Program Year</u> 2023 - 2024

Phyllis Stogbauer, Senior Deputy Director, FRWDB, presented for the Committee's review and approval, the recapture of \$494,175 of Service Providers' Program Year (PY) 2023 – 2024 Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Adult and Youth Program contracted funds, for carryover into PY 2024 – 2025.

Ms. Stogbauer explained that contractual expenditures were running lower than planned as of February 2024. She stated that the decrease in contractual expenditures was due to underperformance of planned expenditure goals and stressed that it was not due to a Provider performance issue.

BARNES/AVILA – APPROVED THE WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT CONTRACT RECAPTURE OF FUNDS FOR PROGRAM YEAR 2023 - 2024. (UNANIMOUS)

5. Skills Development Training Services

Director Blunt left the room prior to the presentation of this item.

Ms. Stogbauer presented a recommendation for the Committee to approve IMAGO as a contractor to provide staff development and training services for workforce services staff and participants, on an as needed basis.

FRWDB released a Request for Proposals (RFP) on January 17, 2024, and held a bidders conference on January 23, 2024. As of the proposal submission deadline of February 13, 2024, only one (1) proposal was received (IMAGO's). An evaluation team met on March 20, 2024, to review and score the proposal. IMAGO was awarded 86.8 points, which exceeded the minimum required score of 70 points. Approval of this item would place IMAGO on an Approved Vendor List (AVL) that FRWDB and Provider staff can use without having to release a procurement to find a vendor every time training services were needed.

Director Barnes asked if there was a plan for FRWDB to continue to try to identify other providers to be included on the AVL. Ms. Stogbauer indicated that yes, FRWDB staff did plan to do another procurement to identify additional contractors for the AVL. Director Zabrycki asked what was the length of the contract with IMAGO. Ms. Stogbauer explained that this was not for a specific contract, and that a contract would not be entered into until needed services had been identified. Contractors approved under this RFP would remain on the AVL for a period of no more than four (4) years.

RIOJAS/BARNES – APPROVED IMAGO AS AN APPROVED CONTRACTOR FOR SKILLS DEVELOPMENT TRAINING SERVICES. (UNANIMOUS, WITH RECUSAL NOTED ABOVE)

6. High Roads Construction Careers – High Road Recovery Partnership Round Two

Ashley Matthews, Special Project Manager, FRWDB, presented for the Committee's approval, grant funding allocations for the High Roads Construction Careers – High Road Rovery Partnership Round Two, awarded through the Foundation for California Community Colleges for the period of December 13, 2023, to June 30, 2025.

The FRWDB was awarded a contract in the amount of \$185,000 to conduct an Apprenticeship Readiness Program Equity Study, and to work with the Yosemite Community College District to evaluate the FRWDB's ValleyBuild Multi-Craft Core Curriculum program for college credit. Ms. Matthews explained that, similar to the women's study that was conducted last year, the Apprenticeship Readiness Program Equity Study would be updated to focus on minorities and persons of color, and possible real and perceived barriers to entering pre-apprenticeship programs.

A detail of the \$185,000 in funding allocations was provided in the agenda item.

ZABRYCKI/BLUNT – APPROVED THE HIGH ROADS CONSTRUCTION CAREERS - HIGH ROAD RECOVERY PARTNERSHIP ROUND TWO FUNDING ALLOCATIONS. (UNANIMOUS)

7. Director's Quarterly Update

FRWDB staff distributed a summary of the Executive Director's activities for the period of January through March 2024.

Mr. Konczal spoke briefly about the items on which he spent the most time during the reporting period, which included the continued expansion of the Greater Sierra Forestry Corps (GSFC) to other Central Valley college campuses, particularly College of Sequoias in Reedley and Kern Community College District in Bakersfield. Also related to the GSFC, Mr. Konczal participated in the Associated California Loggers Conference in Reno, where there was a lot of interest in the FRWDB's forestry program. Other items focused on during this period: Work with the FRWDB Marketing Manager on the planning and review of the ValleyBuild billboards; participated in the KABC Town Hall on the minimum wage increase for California's fast food workers; and worked with Director Blunt and Ms. Espinosa on preparation for participation in the Fresno One Voice Trip to Washington, D.C. Mr. Konczal shared that he began initial prospective planning regarding WIOA reauthorization. He stated that the House of Representatives had passed their version of the reauthorization bill and it would now go to the Senate. He shared that he believed the Senate would pass a different version of the reauthorization bill, in which case a conference committee would then have to work out the differences. Mr. Konczal also met with senior leadership at Fresno State regarding funding of the Center for Climate Resiliency.

Mr. Konczal shared with the Committee that he wanted to explore the idea of possibly changing the name of the Fresno Area Workforce Investment Corporation to a name that is more rounded, such as "Valley Area Workforce" or something to that effect. He stated that he would bring some possible new name choices to the Committee at another time, but wanted to broach it with them at today's meeting.

This was an information item.

8. Referral of Agenda Items to Other Committees

There were no agenda items referred to other committees.

9. Information Sharing

Chair Montalbano shared that he was invited to attend the Central Valley Workforce Collaborative meeting, along with other Central Valley Workforce Development Board (WDB) Chairs. He indicated that there was a lot of good discussions and strong camaraderie.

Chair Montalbano also shared that he and Director Blunt were invited to a listening session for the California Five Year Master Plan for Education. A lot of the session discussions were centered around Career Technical Education (CTE). Director Blunt stated that there is a big opportunity for workforce development to connect with CTE.

Mr. Konczal shared that the Central Valley Regional Community Foundation had been hosting meetings regarding California Jobs First. Mr. Konczal, along with the Executive Directors from the Madera, Tulare and Kings County WDBs, were invited to participate in a meeting recently where there was a discussion about CTE. He noted that the WDBs' outcomes for CTE had to include leading individuals to unsubsidized employment.

Director Zabrycki suggested that the FRWDB highlight two (2) siblings who both received scholarships for training from the FRWDB on the same day, stating that it was an interesting story.

This was an information item.

RECOMMENDATION:

Accept the Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB) May 2024 Financial Report.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:

The attached summary financial report and charts display year-to-date financial information through May 31, 2024.

- Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Rapid Response: On May 20, 2024, this grant received an extension to September 30, 2024. It is 61.80% expended at \$195,528.
- Transformative Climate Communities (TCC): This grant ended May 31, 2024. It was 42.04% expended at \$529,816 with an unspent amount of \$719,616. The FRWDB acted as a passthrough for TCC funds to a community partner that was initially awarded funding under the TCC grant. Awarded in 2020, the grant experienced multiple delays due to the pandemic, including the delay of the purchase of a low emission truck required for the training. Furthermore, the grant funds were specifically targeted to residents in only two (2) west Fresno zip code areas: 93706 and 93721. It was found that there was less interest for truck driver training in these two (2) areas than was initially anticipated.
- CAL FIRE Round 1: As of May 31, 2024, this grant was fully expended at \$1,675,200.
- Equity and Special Populations: This grant ended March 31, 2024. It was 74.63% expended at \$559,751 with an unspent amount of \$190,249.
- City of Fresno One Youth Job Corps: FRWDB was awarded an additional \$100,000 for client support services in January 2024. This grant received an extension to June 30, 2024, from May 1, 2024. It is 85.58% expended at \$640,731 with an unspent amount of \$107,949.
- Staff has no concerns with other grant expenditures at this time.

SUBJECT: Program Year 2024-2025 Agency Budget and Personnel Plan

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend that the Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB) approve the Program Year (PY) 2024-2025 FRWDB Agency Budget and Agency Personnel Plan. Expenditures may exceed individual budget line items as long as total expenditures do not exceed the total budget.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:

The Schedule of Funds, Attachment I, details the total funds, including estimated carryover from PY 2023-2024, and estimated funds available for PY 2024-2025. \$17,130,733 in Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Formula Allocations for PY 2024-2025 from the Employment Development Department Workforce Services Division, \$6,049,884 in estimated prior year carryover funds from PY 2023-2024, and \$27,374,921 in estimated Special Grant funding. Overall, it is estimated that funding will increase \$2,358,216.

Attachment II, Staff Schedule, details staff positions for the agency. The cost for all FRWDB staff is included in the Agency Budget on Attachment III. These amounts include the cost for Administrative Services, Program Support, Information Technology Support, and America's Job Centers of California Site Support.

Attachment III details the proposed Agency Budget for PY 2024-2025, as compared to the PY 2023-2024 budget. The attached budget reflects:

- \$418,626 increase to salaries.
- \$29,539 increase to payroll taxes.
- \$109,117 increase to benefits.
- \$10,000 decrease to communications.
- \$10,000 increase to maintenance.
- \$10,000 decrease to memberships.
- \$5,000 increase to miscellaneous.
- \$2,400 increase to office expense.
- \$5,000 increase to rent and lease copiers expenditures.
- \$2,400 increase (6%) to utilities.
- \$487,000 net decrease to furniture and equipment.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Rapid Response and Layoff Aversion funding allocations in the amount of \$556,082 for Program Year (PY) 2024-25.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION:

The Employment Development Department (EDD) Workforce Services Division released the WIOA Rapid Response and Layoff Aversion funding allocations for PY 2024-2025 on June 25, 2024, which allocated \$556,082 to the FRWDB for Rapid Response and Layoff Aversion services in Fresno County. The attachment provides the allocations for Rapid Response and Layoff Aversion funding.

FRWDB staff is recommending the approval of the following funding allocations for PY 2024-2025:

- \$220,000 to Central Labor Council Partnership to provide Rapid Response and Layoff Aversion services for Fresno County through June 30, 2025.
- \$336,082 to FRWDB staff for contract and program oversight of Rapid Response and Layoff Aversion services for PY 2024-2025

FISCAL IMPACT:

Approval of the item will result in the allocation of \$556,082: \$429,712 of Rapid Response funding and \$126,370 of Layoff Aversion funding.
