Description/Action Taken Item

May 23, 2024, Adult Council Meeting Minutes 1.

Blake Konczal, Executive Director, Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board (FRWDB), presented the May 23, 2024, Adult Council (Council) meeting minutes for the Council's approval.

OLIVARES/BRANCH - APPROVED THE MAY 23, 2024, ADULT COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES. (UNANIMOUS)

Adult Business of Excellence Award Winner 2.

Martha Espinosa, Deputy Director of Marketing, Grants and Business Initiatives, FRWDB, announced that the Second Quarter Adult Business of Excellence Award winner was the Central California Almond Growers Association (CCAGA). She shared a video highlighting the CCAGA and their experience hiring a Workforce participant. The CCAGA's Human Resources (HR) Manager was previously a participant in the FRWDB's Workforce program and she shared how Workforce assisted her in her journey as an HR professional. Ms. Espinosa noted that word of mouth is the most effective marketing tool and this story was a good example of that.

This was an information item.

3. Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Adult and Dislocated Worker Carryover Funding Recommendations for Program Year 2024-2025

Phyllis Stogbauer, Senior Deputy Director, FRWDB, presented for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB, the Adult and Dislocated Worker Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) carryover funding recommendations for Program Year (PY) 2024-2025. Ms. Stogbauer reminded the Council that at its June 4, 2024, meeting, the FRWDB approved the Adult and Dislocated Worker WIOA funding recommendations that were prepared based on estimated funding allotments released by the State of California Employment Development Department (EDD). She explained that on June 6, 2024, the EDD released final WIOA allocations for PY 2024-2025, which increased the FRWDB's award by \$4,369, bringing the total allocation for Adult and Dislocated Worker funds to \$10,446,984.

Ms. Stogbauer reviewed the proposed budget revisions with the Council, as outlined in the agenda item, which included increases and decreases to various budget line items. She noted that Providers' contracts would not be impacted by the additional \$4,369, and that carryover to PY 2024-2025 was reduced to \$4,156,527. Director Olivares noted that the carryover was still a good amount.

OLIVARES/BRANCH - RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB APPROVE THE WORKFORCE INNOVATION AND OPPORTUNITY ACT ADULT AND DISLOCATED WORKER CARRYOVER FUNDING RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PROGRAM YEAR 2024-2025. (UNANIMOUS)

4. Local Performance Results Reports

Ms. Stogbauer presented for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB, the PY 2023-2024 Fourth Quarter (Q4) and PY 2024-2025 First Quarter (Q1) Adult and Dislocated Worker Program Providers of Services' Local Performance Results Reports. She noted that the Q4 Reports for numbers served showed Adult Rural East slightly lower than plan, and both Adult and Dislocated Worker Rural West lower than plan with Adult at 71% and Dislocated Worker at 78%. She noted that all other performance results for Q4 were at levels at or above performance requirements. Director Olivares noted that results for the rural areas are challenging. Ms. Stogbauer agreed and indicated that Ms. Espinosa, FRWDB Deputy Director of Marketing, Grants and Business Initiatives, had been working on strategies to bring more individuals to the rural sites. Ms. Stogbauer added that on the west side in particular, transportation, language and digital literacy barriers were a major part of the challenges in serving individuals.

Ms. Espinosa shared that billboards had been placed in the rural areas and that a contract was signed with La Buena to do more marketing in Spanish to reach those areas.

Director Olivares asked that the "Plan" and "Actual" legends on the Report be moved lower on the page, to make it easier to see. Ms. Stogbauer indicated that FRWDB staff would make that change.

OLIVARES/BRANCH - RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB ACCEPT THE LOCAL PERFORMANCE RESULTS REPORTS. (UNANIMOUS)

5. Providers of Services' Monitoring Report

Rebecca Moncivais, Monitoring Manager, FRWDB, presented this item in Ms. Beierschmitt's absence.

Ms. Moncivais presented the PY 2024-2025 Q1 Monitoring Report for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB. She reviewed the Program and Fiscal Monitoring that were either completed or in process during Q1. There was a discussion by the Council regarding the Results column on the report, noting that "All Findings Closed" did not provide the Council with information about what was done to close the findings.

Ms. Stogbauer explained the process by which the Monitoring Unit prepared the Report. Mr. Konczal noted that the format on the Report could be changed, but that it was the same format that had been used for years. He then stated that at the next meeting, FRWDB staff would provide an overview of the process that is followed to generate the Report to help Councilmembers understand it better.

OLIVARES/BRANCH – RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB APPROVE THE PROVIDERS OF SERVICES' MONITORING REPORT. (UNANIMOUS)

6. Job Seeker Customer Satisfaction Reports

Ms. Stogbauer presented the PY 2023-2024 Q4 and PY 2024-2025 Q1 Job Seeker Customer Satisfaction Reports for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB. Director Olivares asked about one (1) of the customer comments about having a Zoom room available. Ms. Stogbauer stated that she was going to look into that comment as it was unique, and that FRWDB may want to consider making a Zoom room available for participants to use for job interviews. Director Olivares commended FRWDB Provider staff for their good work, noting that the comments from participants were very positive.

OLIVARES/BRANCH – RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB APPROVE THE JOB SEEKER CUSTOMER SATISFACTION REPORTS. (UNANIMOUS)

7. Program Year 2022-2023 Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Local Area Adult and Dislocated Worker Program Performance Results

Tim Giles, Deputy Director of Information and General Services, FRWDB, presented for the Council's recommendation to the FRWDB, the PY 2022-2023 Adult and Dislocated Worker WIOA Local Area Performance Results. He explained that the report shows the FRWDB's performance scores in six (6) WIOA primary indicators, and that the State of California set a performance score for each of the indicators. The report showed that the FRWDB exceeded requirements in all areas.

OLIVARES/BRANCH - RECOMMENDED THAT THE FRWDB ACCEPT THE PY 2022-2023 WIOA LOCAL AREA ADULT AND DISLOCATED WORKER PROGRAM PERFORMANCE RESULTS. (UNANIMOUS)

8. Adult and Dislocated Worker Demogrphics Reports

Mr. Giles presented the PY 2023-2024 Q4 and PY 2024-2025 Q1 Adult and Dislocated Worker Demographics Report for the Council's information. He reviewed the reports, which showed a breakdown of demographic information at enrollment by gender, age, barriers, ethnicity, and education.

This was an information item.

9. America's Job Centers of California Usage Report

Mr. Giles presented the AJCC Usage Report, which is a 13-month trend report that shows the client usage at the AJCC, broken out by unique clients receiving AJCC services and then the number of client visits to the AJCC by month. The Council had no questions about the Report.


















ATTACHMENT I: Adult Demographics Second Quarter, Program Year 2024-2025

ATTACHMENT II: Dislocated Worker Demographics Second Quarter, Program Year 2024-2025













Adult Demographics Second Quarter, Program Year 2024-2025








Adult Demographics Second Quarter, Program Year 2024-2025







Dislocated Worker Demographics Second Quarter, Program Year 2024-2025









Dislocated Worker Demographics Second Quarter, Program Year 2024-2025






Dislocated Worker Demographics Second Quarter, Program Year 2024-2025
